About:

Two families divided by religion and nationality have to decide if they can come together in this remarkable documentary. In the early 1940s, 14-year-old Pnina disappeared from her home in the Galilee. Years later she began sending letters to her family from her new home in the West Bank. The film chronicles the filmmaker's journeys to uncover the mysteries of her great-aunt Pnina and her family in the Palestinian Territories with the help of her uncle, a retired colonel in Israeli intelligence, to see if the families could be reunited, and reveals the complexities involved when a family member marries 'out'.
